Canadian CT Head-Level II Evidence

Head CT is indicated for patients with mild traumatic brain injury and one of the following:

- 1. GCS <15 two hours after injury
- 2. Suspected open or depressed skull fracture
- Any sign of basilar skull fracture (hemotympanum, raccoon eyes, Battle's sign, CSF leak)
- 4. Two or more episodes of vomiting
- 5. 65 years or older
- 6. Amnesia prior to impact of 30 minutes or more
- Dangerous mechanism (fall from >=3 feet or >=5 stairs, struck by motor vehicle, occupant ejected from motor vehicle)

*Presence of seizure, neurologic deficit, bleeding disorder, anticoagulant use, altered mental status (Etoh/drug) is also indication for head CT as these patients excluded from original study.

Nexus Criteria/C-spine-Level I Evidence

C-spine imaging is necessary if one of the following criteria is met:

- 1. Midline cervical tenderness
- 2. Focal neurologic deficit
- 3. Altered level of consciousness
- 4. Evidence of intoxication
- 5. Painful distracting injury
